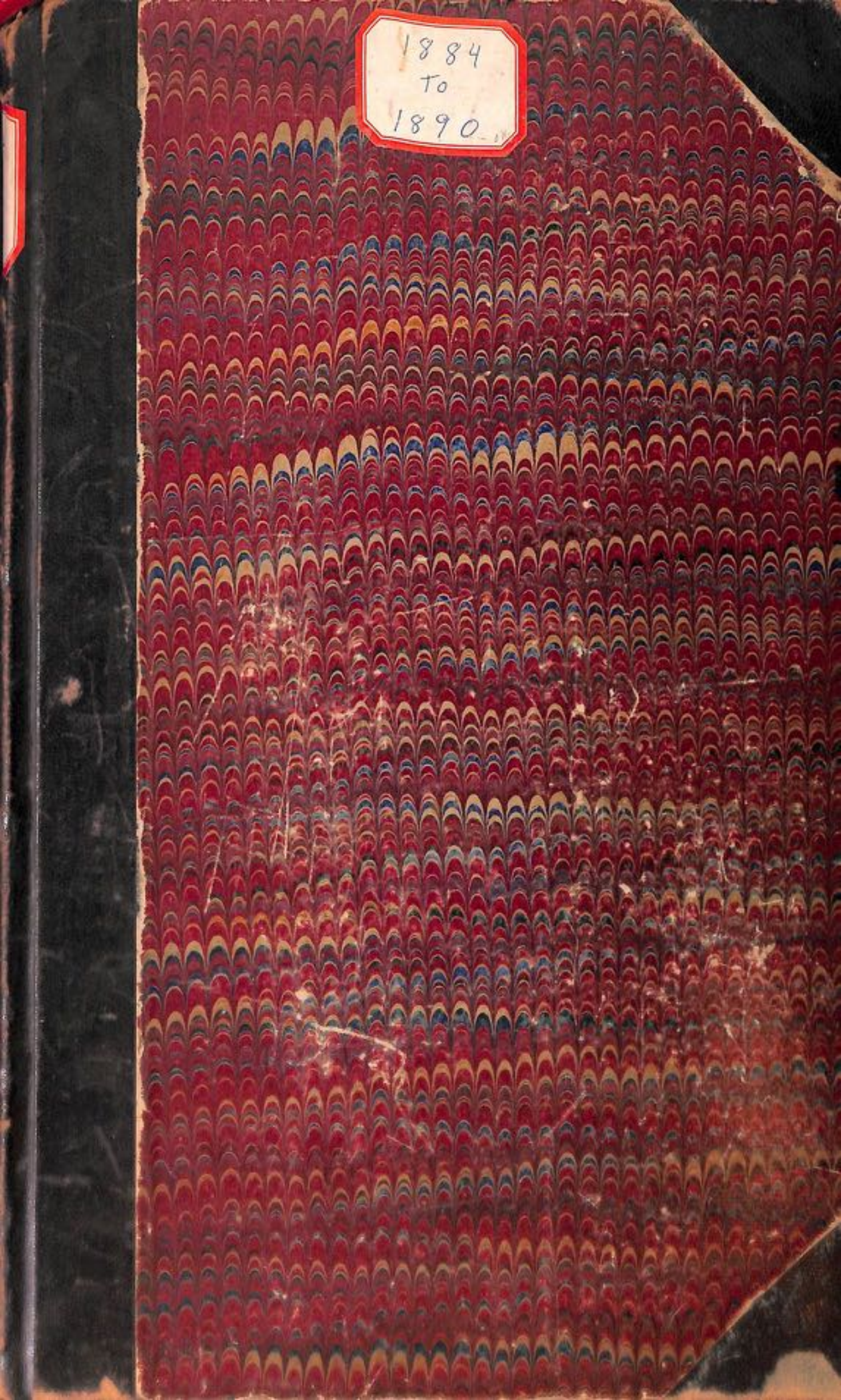

### INDEX.

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### SUGGESTIONS TO SECRETARY.

After entering Constitution and By-Laws, divide remaining pages with a line, and have all members and such as may hereafter be elected sign their names. Do not enroll a person until the conditions of membership as specified in Constitution have been complied with.

In "Roll of Members" the first column is intended for the page of minutes when member was elected; also the individual account.

On page of "Committees," last column refers to page in minutes when committee was appointed and discharged.

"Roll Call," first column, refers to individual account, to which will be charged such fine for non-attendance as may be provided for by Constitution; as such charge is made it will be noted in the date column opposite each name by a check mark ✓. Opposite "Appointment" note the character of the gathering by the initial letter, thus: M., Meeting; S. M., Special Meeting; F., Fires, etc.

In "General Cash" record all moneys received or paid; when received from members in payment of dues, fines or assessments, record their name, and from this account post to the credit of the individual account, noting the page in the column next the dollar space.

At the end of each month, or quarter, charge to each member on his individual account (left hand side) such dues as may be imposed by the Constitution.

We, the undersigned, have adopted and agree to be governed by the following Constitution and By-Laws.

#### Article 1.

This company shall be called and known as Forest Engine Company, No 1.

#### Article 2.

The Officers of this company shall consist of a Foreman, Assistant Foreman, Foreman of Hose, Steward, Clerk, Treasurer, and a Standing Committee of three, to be chosen annually, on the second Monday in January.

#### Article 3.

The Foreman shall appoint two Suction Hoseman, and the Foreman of Hose shall appoint four Leading Hoseman, to assist in the discharge of his duties, - all to be under the command of the Foreman.

#### Article 4.

It shall be the duty of the Foreman to preside at all meetings of the company; he shall direct the entire operation of the company at all fires and drills, see that all the officers and members perform their respective duties as enjoined by the constitution, and give the casting vote in all equal divisions; he shall have authority to call the company together at such times and for such purposes as he may see fit, and it shall be his duty to do so on application being made to him, signed by three members.

In his absence the duty shall devolve on the Assistant Foreman, and in case of both, upon the Foreman of Hose.

## Article 5.

The Foreman of Hose shall have charge of the hose, under the direction of the Foreman; and in the absence of the Foreman and Assistant Foreman shall have command of the company at all fires.

## Article 6.

The pay of the company shall be as follows: the Clerk and Treasurer of the company shall receive the sum of ten dollars each, for their services, annually; the Foreman of Hose, and four Hosesmen, shall receive the sum of eight dollars each; the Steward shall receive the sum of twenty-five dollars, and the remainder of the members shall receive the sum of six dollars and seventy-five cents each, annually, subject to all fines and assessments.

## Article 7.

The Clerk shall keep a faithful record of all proceedings of the company, notify the members of all meetings, collect all assessments and fines due to the company and pay the same to the Treasurer, taking his receipt for the same.

## Article 8.

The Treasurer shall receive all money due the company, and give his receipt for the same; he shall pay all orders drawn on the funds of the company, when signed by the Foreman and clerk, and shall be required to give bonds to the Foreman sum of five hundred dollars, payable to the Foreman, and to be ready to make a report at any regular meeting.

## Article 9.

The Steward shall keep the Engine House in perfect order, and have the engine ready for use at any moment. He shall see that order is preserved at Engine House at all times, and it shall be his duty to see that section two of By-Laws is enforced, and for all expenses incurred, he shall be paid by the company.

## Article 10.

The Standing Committee shall examine and report the names of all persons wishing to become members of the company, and have charge of all property belonging to the company, except money; audit the accounts of the Clerk, and Treasurer, and report to the company at the annual meeting.

## Article 11.

The annual meeting for the election of officers shall be held on the second Monday in January, and the regular meetings shall be held on the second Monday in each month, at 7 1/2 o'clock, P. M.

## Article 12.

It shall be the duty of each member to repair immediately to the engine house on every alarm of fire, unless he shall meet the engine on the way, or know that it is in advance of him, and shall continue to discharge his duty as a fireman, under the direction of the commanding officer, during the continuance of any fire and until he is regularly dismissed after the engine is housed and the roll called.

## Article 13.

Every member appointed on a committee shall attend to the duties assigned him at the time and place appointed by the chairman, (who shall be the first member chosen) and every committee, as soon as may be, shall report their doings to the company.

## Article 14.

The Foreman shall have power to fill all vacancies which may occur in any of the offices, for the time being; he shall call special meetings when required by three members, or at any time when in his opinion the interest of the company require it. Should a permanent vacancy occur in any of the offices, it shall be filled by a vote of the company. Eleven members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

## Article 15.

Any person wishing to become a member of this company, must first make application to the Standing Committee, who shall report to the company at first

regular meeting; then a ballot will be taken of the company, and if candidate does not receive five black balls, he shall be declared elected and a member, by signing the By-Laws.

## Article 16.

It shall be the duty of the Clerk upon the election of a new member, to give such person notice thereof in writing, within four days next after his election, and if the person thus elected and notified shall neglect for the space of thirty days after such notice to join the company and comply with the requisitions of the By-Laws, he shall no longer be considered a member elected, and his rights to join said company shall be forfeited.

## Article 17.

If any member shall absent himself from fires or meetings he shall pay the following fines: When absent from fires, 50 cents; roll call, 28 cents; regular and special meetings, 56 cents, if he does not give a reasonable excuse. If any member shall be absent from three successive meetings, except by reason of sickness, he shall forfeit his membership, unless a majority of the company vote to excuse him. If any member leave at a fire, except his own property be in danger, or he obtain leave of the Foreman, he shall pay a fine of 50 cents, and any member who shall fail to appear and render a sufficient excuse to the Foreman on or before the next meeting after said fire, shall not be excused.

## Article 18.

At an alarm of fire the Foreman, or in his absence the Assistant Foreman, or in case of the absence of both, the Foreman of Hose shall have entire command of the engine and of the company going to and coming from the fire and direct each member to a proper place and also to judge of all excuses for absence from fires.

## Article 19.

The company can give any member an honorable discharge at his own request, by his paying to the Clerk all arrears due from him to said company, and delivering all property in his possession belonging to the company to the Standing Committee.

And if any member, while on duty, shall be guilty of any disorderly or ungentlemanly conduct, he may be reprimanded by the Foreman, or dismissed at the pleasure of the company.

## Article 20.

Any person may become an honorable member of this company, by a two thirds vote of all its members; and every member who shall be present when a question is put, shall vote for or against the same, unless excused by the Chairman.

## Article 21.

No person not a member shall be allowed to wear the uniform of this company, without obtaining the consent of the Standing Committee.

## Article 22.

No member of the company shall furnish a substitute.

## Article 23.

Any member of this company who shall be guilty of reporting any proceedings of the company required by him to be kept secret, or should knowingly expose or report unfavorably of any member to those not members of the company, shall be expelled at any meeting by a vote of a majority of those present.

## Article 24.

This Constitution may be altered or amended at any regular meeting, by a vote of two thirds of the members present; provided notice of such proposed alteration or amendment has given at a previous regular meeting.

## By-Laws.

## Section 1.

Any member becoming intoxicated while on duty or in engine house shall be liable to a discharge from the company.

## Section 2.

Smoking is strictly prohibited in the company's hall; and also all disorderly conduct or nuisance in or around the engine house.

## Section 3.

The Clerk shall deliver copies of the By-Laws and keys to the engine house, to members, by their paying the sum of twenty-five cents. When members leave the company they shall return the keys and By-Laws, and their money shall be refunded.

## Section 4.

The roll shall be called at the opening and the close of each meeting, both regular and special.

## Section 5.

No money in the treasury shall be appropriated for any purpose without the two thirds vote of the company at a regular or special meeting.

## Section 6.

Any member absent from a regular or special meeting, unless he renders his excuse on or before the next regular meeting, will be unexcusable.

## Section 7.

Any By-Laws, not contrary to the Constitution, may be adopted at any regular meeting of the company.
